Proposal for the 4th G20 Finance and Central Bank Deputies (FCBD) meeting

1. Mobilizing Capital for Financing a Just Transition

- a. Make capital mobilization a central goal of MDBs (Multilateral Development Banks) and DFIs (Development Finance Institutions), foccused on thematic and regional criteria to drive financing structures for initiatives led and developed by local stakeholders in Emerging Markets and Developing Economies (EMDEs) and advance Just Transition plans, especially in SMEs (Small and Medium Enterprises) that generate jobs;
- b. Implement the established public-private collaboration model of results-based partnerships to mobilize private capital in high-impact areas, including education and reskilling.
- c. Invest in establishing new Public-Private-Philanthropic-Partnerships (PPPP) as Multi-Stakeholder Platforms (MSPs) to improve and increase blended finance and mobilize catalytic private capital for systemic, collective, and plurilateral action.
- d. Implement a proposal to tax the super-rich in order to mobilize resources for financing a just transition.
- e. Promote catalytic capital financing for low-CO2 urban mobility actions and clean transportation infrastructure and consolidate foreign exchange protection mechanisms for risk sharing.

2. Accelerating the Economic Paradigm Shift to a More Just and Sustainable Model

- a. Incorporate holistic well-being indicators into national accounting systems to prioritize human and ecological well-being in all public policies, beyond the pursuit of economic growth as an end in itself.
- b. Recognize the contribution of the impact and social economie as key to sustainable development and just transition plans, ensuring the participation of these social innovators in public policy formulation and debate for better outcomes for both people and the planet.
- c. Promote the creation of socially inclusive entrepreneurship ecosystems that integrate social assistance programs with economic access and development initiatives, for national and international trade, especially focused on historically marginalized groups (women, Afro-descendants, indigenous peoples, and/or indigenous communities).
